### I. Growing Nationalism

#### A. Nationalism

- 1. Feelings of pride and loyalty to a nation
- 2. Caused by successful negotiations with foreign powers
- 3. Helped by Henry Clay

## B. American System

- 1. Proposed by Henry Clay
- 2. Series of measures intended to make the US economically self-sufficient
  - a. Push for a national bank
    - i. Provide single national currency
    - ii. Improve interstate commerce
  - b. Internal improvements
    - i. Use money from protective tariff
    - ii. Roads and canals

#### C. Roads and Canals

- 1. <u>Cumberland Road</u>: first road built by federal government
  - a. 1815 Cumberland, Maryland to Wheeling, West Virginia
  - b. 1833 expanded to Columbus, Ohio (now called National Road)
  - c. 1850 to Illinois
- 2. Erie Canal: from Albany to Buffalo (New York)
  - a. 1817-1825
  - b. Built by British, German, and Irish immigrants
  - c. Allowed goods and people to move between towns on Lake Erie and New York City

## D. Era of Good Feelings

- 1. Time of peace, pride, and progress
- 2. Name given to James Monroe's Presidency
- 3. McCulloch v. Maryland: Court allowed Congress to create a national bank
- 4. Gibbons v. Ogden: States cannot interfere with the power of Congress to regulate interstate commerce

#### II. Missouri Compromise

- A. <u>sectionalism</u>: disagreements between different regions
  - 1. Heightened when Missouri asked to join Union
  - 2. Worried about keeping free and slave states balanced

### B. Missouri Compromise

- 1. Missouri joins union as a slave state
- 2. Maine joins union as a free state
- 3. No slavery above the 36°30'N line

# III. Election of 1824

- A. Andrew Jackson: won popular votes, but didn't have enough electoral votes
- B. House of Representatives decide
  - 1. Choose John Quincy Adams
  - 2. corrupt bargain Henry Clay becomes Secretary of State in exchange for support
