FOCUS: What three things were accomplished during the Second Continental Congress?

- 1. Sent the Olive Branch Petition to King George III
- 2. Adopted the Massachusetts militia as the continental army
- 3. Appointed George Washington as commander of the continental army

According to King George III's response to the Olive Branch Petition... the men involved would be charged with <u>TREASON</u>, and the punishment would be death by <u>HANGING</u>.



What effect did "Common Sense" have on the colonists?

- Author: THOMAS PAINE
- Encourages the move towards **INDEPENDENCE** 
  - Argued: CITIZENS SHOULD MAKE LAWS, NOT KINGS AND QUEENS
- Produced <u>500,000</u> copies in just 6 short months.
  - Used BIBLE verses instead of Greek and Latin literature.

Major colonies in FAVOR of independence

- I. MASSACHUSETTS
- 2. VIRGINIA

Major colonies AGAINST independence

- I. PENNSYLVANIA (except B. Franklin)
- 2. SOUTH CAROLINA
- 3. NEW YORK

## Declaration of Independence

## Mr. Dickinson's Concerns

- <u>INDIANS</u> and <u>SLAVES</u> may rise up against us.
- NEW YORK will be destroyed.
- <u>FOREIGN ALLIES</u> will try to take us over.
- Colonies may **SPLIT**.

## John Adams' Closing Argument

- Create a new nation
- Republic based on <u>LAWS</u>, not men
- Opportunity to choose a <u>CHOOSE A</u> <u>SYSTEM OF GOVERNMENT FOR</u> OURSELVES AND OUR CHILDREN

July 2, 1776

APPROVED on JULY 4, 1776

JOHN HANCOCK signed his name differently from the other signers.

Why did he do so?

- PRESIDENT OF THE SECOND CONTINENTAL CONGRESS
- WANTED TO MAKE SURE KING GEORGE III WAS ABLE TO READ HIS NAME WITHOUT HIS GLASSES ON

Declaration of Rights

We hold these truths to be <u>SELF-EVIDENT</u>, that all <u>MEN</u> are created <u>EQUAL</u>; that they are endowed by their <u>CREATOR</u> with certain <u>UNALIENABLE</u> rights;

that among these are LIFE, LIBERTY and the pursuit of HAPPINESS.
