Hamilton versus Jefferson; Formation of Political Parties

Alexander Hamilton (Secretary of the Treasury) inherits a very large problem: Paying off the national debt from the Revolutionary War.

His Financial Plan

1. Deal with the Debt

- Pay back foreign and domestic debt by replacing old bonds with new, interest-bearing bonds
- Assume (take on the responsibility of) most of the states' debts.
- ARGUMENT:
 - **Southern states** were very unhappy with this portion of the plan.
 - They did not have much debt and/or already paid their debts.
 - Battles occurred in the North, not the South = less to rebuild/lower debt
 - Thomas Jefferson (Secretary of State) also unhappy with plan
 - From Virginia
 - Anti-Federalist (stronger state governments)

2. Gain Revenue

- Pass a tariff to bring in money and help American manufacturers
- Stabilize the banking system by creating a national bank and national mint.
- ARGUMENT:
 - According to Constitution/Bill of Rights, any power not directly listed in the Constitution belongs to the state governments example: banks
 - Thomas Jefferson argued that a national bank was unconstitutional
- COUNTERARGUMENT:
 - Alexander Hamilton makes the counterargument regarding the elastic clause, which gives
 the government the opportunity to make laws that are "necessary and proper" and change
 overtime.

Formation of Political Parties

FEDERALISTS

- Supported Alexander Hamilton
- Favored a **strong national government**
 - Wanted to interpret the Constitution loosely allowed the national government to have more power
- Believed the economy should focus on manufacturing and trade
- Favored a foreign alliance with **Great Britain**
- The **North** and merchants favored this political party

DEMOCRATIC-REPUBLICANS

- Supported **Thomas Jefferson**
- Favored a weaker national government with strong state governments
 - Wanted to interpret the Constitution **strictly** any power not listed in the Constitution belonged to the state governments = the national government less power
- Believed the economy should focus on agriculture
- Favored a foreign alliance with **France**
- The **South** and **farmers** favored this political party
