- → LATE HOMEWORK WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED.
- LATE ASSIGNMENTS can be submitted one day late for HALF CREDIT. If the assignment is submitted two or more days late, it will earn a zero.

PLAGIARISM/CHEATING

To plagiarize is defined as taking ideas and writings of another and passing them off as your own. All students involved in plagiarism will be given a ZERO for the assignment. PLAGIARISM INCLUDES...

- turning in someone else's paper AS YOUR OWN
- → COPYING A FRIEND'S PAPER before class (or having another teacher catch you copying work in his/her classroom)
- → failing to [[] a source
- copying an AUTHOR'S EXACT WORDS and passing them off as your own.

ABSENTEE POLICY

- YES WE DID SOMETHING IMPORTANT WHILE YOU WERE ABSENT. It is your responsibility to check with a friend (or me) the day you return to class to find out what you missed. Check the MAKE-UP BINDER OR THE CLASS WEBSITE to find any handouts you missed.
- [-SUBMISSION POLICY. You are always welcome to email me your assignments. There is no excuse to not have an assignment in on time. PRINTER AND INTERNET ISSUES ARE NOT AN EXCUSE. If technology failures happen, hand-write your assignment.
- Any assignment you are absent for will be entered as a ZERO UNTIL IT IS TURNED IN.

ABSENT DAY BEFORE A TEST

YOU WILL BE EXPECTED TO TAKE THE TEST ON THE DAY YOU RETURN if no new material was covered in class that day.

ABSENT ON TEST DAY

YOU WILL BE EXPECTED TO TAKE THE TEST ON THE DAY YOU RETURN - during your study lab, before or after school. You may also be pulled from another class to take your test. *Exception*: Extended absences will be dealt with on an individual basis.

ABSENT ON DUE DATE

- → If you are present at any time during the school day when an assignment is due, make arrangements for that assignment to be turned in that day. FIELD TRIPS, LATE ARRIVALS AND EARLY DISMISSALS ARE NOT EXCUSES FOR SUBMISSION OF LATE WORK. (Exception: Sent home by the nurse)
